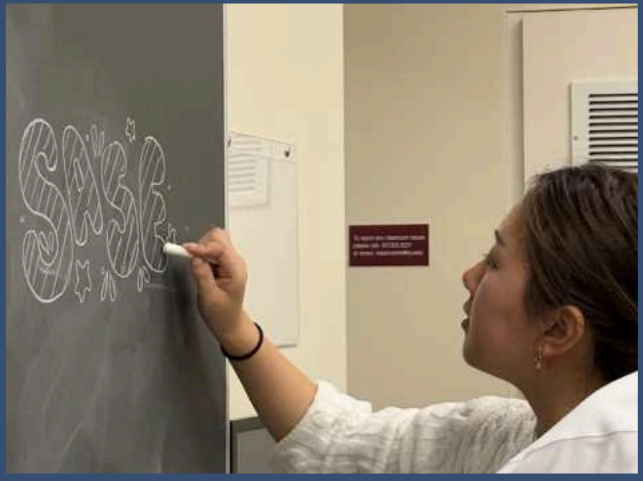

As the second pillar of BU SASE, we are dedicated to organizing and promoting events that celebrate the diversity in Asian heritages and cultures.

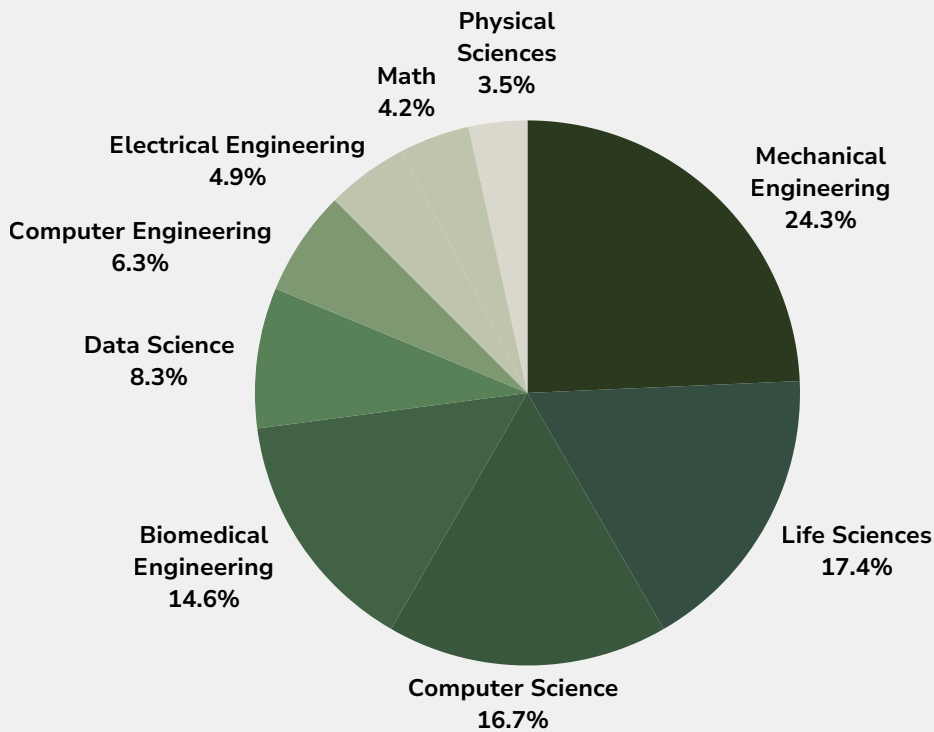
Community Service

MAJOR DISTRIBUTION

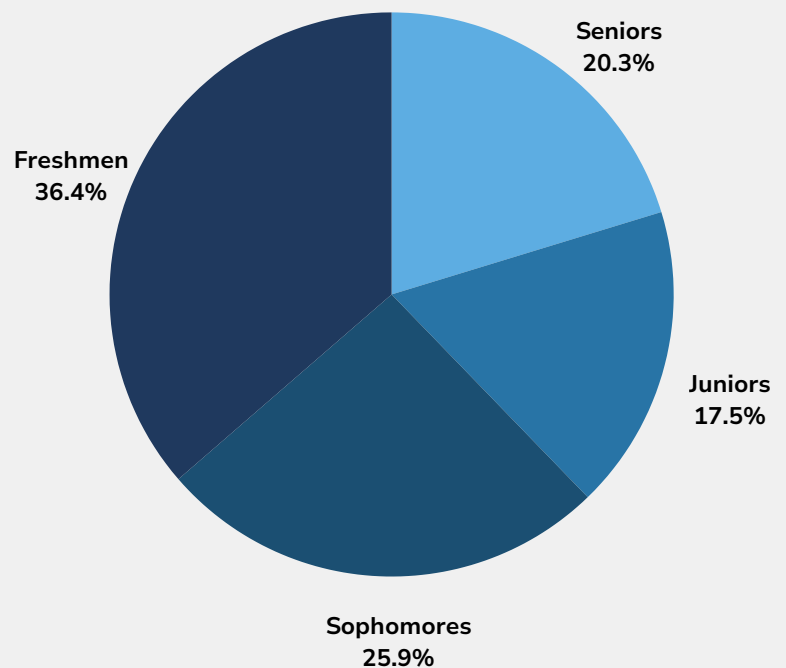


This past year, BU SASE has seen the largest membership growth in recent years, with over **140** active members!

CONFERENCES

STEM Connect

STEM Connect (previously known as the SASE National Convention) is the largest annual conferences for Asian Americans in the US. Drawing over 3000 professionals and students from around the country, this three-day long convention provides invaluable opportunities to network with industry professionals and students across the nation, attend insightful panels, and engage in a variety of workshops. In 2024, STEM Connect was hosted in Boston, allowing our chapter to send **81 members**. Several members secured summer internships, and **over 10** received interviews from this opportunity!



Northeast Regional Conference (NERC)

NERC is the other annual conference for Asian-heritage scientists and engineers in the Northeast, offering leadership workshops, career development, and networking opportunities. Nine members from our chapter attended this year, gaining insights from industry leaders, enhancing their professional skills, and building meaningful connections across chapters.



PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Networking Night

Our fall semester's annual professional event invites AAPI industry professionals from various STEM fields, including biotech, medicine, aerospace, and more, to join us for a night of networking and panel discussions. Through casual networking and Q&A sessions, members are able to connect with industry professionals and learn more about opportunities after graduation.

Innovation Symposium

Innovation Symposium engages both undergraduate and graduate students through a research symposium and panel discussion. Asian-heritage graduate students are invited to showcase their research and share their experiences navigating academia, while undergraduates gain insights into the variety of research areas and opportunities.



BU Spark! x BU SASE Industry Tours

Last semester, we launched a new professional development initiative aimed to provide insight into various industries through site tours and networking sessions. Through these tours, members learned about cutting-edge research at biotech start-ups, explored manufacturing processes at leading industry firms, and more!

BU SASE x Theta Tau Resume Review

Through collaboration with Boston University's chapter of Theta Tau, a professional engineering fraternity, our chapter co-hosted a resume review, where underclassmen paired with upperclassmen to receive valuable insight and constructive feedback on their resumes.

CULTURAL HERITAGE

VSA x SASE Holiday Party

Bringing in the festivities, our chapter hosted an annual collaboration with the Vietnamese Student Association (VSA) to celebrate the end of the first semester and the holiday season. Across hot chocolate and various festive activities, members of both organizations got to socialize and build meaningful bonds.



General Body Meetings

Our chapter's general body meetings (GBMs) aim to foster community amongst individuals by creating chill environments for members to meet new people. Through our GBMs, we also aim to promote diversity through cultural celebrations for holidays like the Mid Autumn Festival and Holi, as well as events inspired by various Asian pop-culture like Squid Games themed trivia.



AAPI Celebration @ the Museum of Science

In celebration of AAPI heritage month, our chapter was invited to table alongside various AAPI organizations across Massachusetts at the Museum of Science in Cambridge. Through this event, our chapter had the opportunity to connect those AAPI organizations, learn about their initiatives, and engage in meaningful conversations.

COMMUNITY SERVICE



Mass Audubon Habitat Restoration

Through collaboration with Mass Audubon, members rolled up their sleeves to remove invasive species and restore natural habitats; working alongside Nigerian dwarf goats to support the longevity and biodiversity of the ecosystem.

Charles River Conservancy Clean Up

With environmental stewardship as a core focus of our service events, members volunteered with the Charles River Conservancy to help remove litter around the Charles River as part of an effort to maintain local biodiversity and ecosystems.

Bruins TD Garden Volunteering

Engaging in local sports culture, our chapter joined forces with Boston University's Theta Tau to volunteer at TD garden for the Boston Bruins Foundation's 50/50 Raffle, raising **over \$5000** for youth and community programs in the Greater Boston area

CommonCare Meal Prep

In partnership with CommonCare, members participated in a heartfelt meal prep by preparing dinners for individuals facing food insecurity, fostering empathy and teamwork by supporting underserved populations around the Greater Boston.



ENGAGEMENT PROGRAMS

Mentorship Program

Our mentorship program connects underclassmen with upperclassmen who guide them through life at BU, academics, professional development, and more! Groups are formed through events like speed dating and mentorship brunch, with many bonds lasting way beyond the program. This past year we had our highest engagement yet, with **27** mentor-mentee groups.



Study with SASE

Study with SASE provides members with a collaborative environment to study, complete assignments, and help others out with schoolwork. This program aims to strengthen connections and foster community amongst members.

Sunrise Hike

Alongside the Northeastern chapter of SASE, BU SASE embarks on an annual sunrise hike at Blue Hills Reservation. Members of both chapters get the chance to touch grass and form intercollegiate bonds in this early morning adventure.

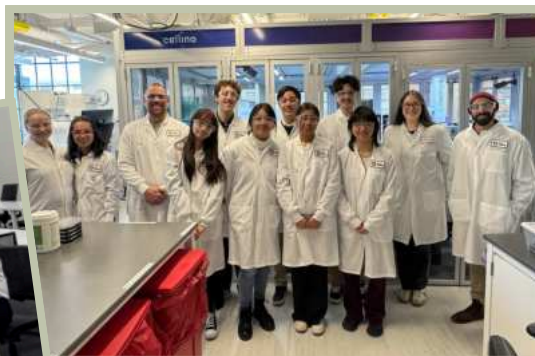
